

## Scholarship Information for Seniors

The following list of scholarships is updated on a weekly basis. Lists will be available in the Guidance Office and on the Guidance webpage. Seniors should check the list on a regular basis. Many applications are found in the top drawer of the file cabinet in the Guidance Office. Others will only be available via the Internet so check the specifics carefully. If you are taking the last application out of the folder, please let Mr. Police know so that he can make more for other students.

There are instructions for each scholarship and most will be returned to Mr. Police in the Guidance Office. **PLEASE PAY ATTENTION TO THE DEADLINES LISTED ON THE SCHOLARSHIP LIST!** Applications often need to be processed by counselors before being submitted to the sponsoring organization. Applications received after the stated deadline may not be eligible for consideration.

Below are some suggestions to remember when completing scholarship applications:

- 1) BE NEAT AND COMPLETE! Nothing hurts an application more than sloppy handwriting or missing pieces.
- 2) Proofread your final product and have someone else proofread it as well.
- 3) Type/word process applications whenever possible; if applications must be handwritten use black pen (same color throughout).
- 4) When asking others for letters of recommendation, give teachers, employers, coaches, etc. plenty of time to meet the deadline (approximately 2 weeks ahead). Give them a copy of a completed **Senior Data Form** (print or share via Google). Make sure to let recommenders know specific submission guidelines: printed letter, online recommendation, etc.
- 5) Keep a copy of all application materials in a personal file.

- Requires application, essay, and transcript
- Deadline: return to Guidance by April 30

- \$500+ scholarship awarded to graduating seniors planning to pursue post-secondary education in Construction Technology or another construction-related field OR pursuing full-time employment in construction
- Requires application, essay, and recommendations (2)
